## Deputy Chief of Support Report on District Projects:

Deputy Chief of Support Koger gave a brief update on District Projects.

Support Building: Waiting on completion date but should be by the end of 2023.

#### **Interim Chief Koger's Report:**

Interim Chief Koger reported that the Chief staff and Board of directors decided to reduce \$8 million reserves to \$4 million. This will allow us to add equipment and employees.

Chief Koger reported that the district would like to move forward with hiring 2 fire prevention employees this year, as soon as possible.

Would also like to move forward with the purchasing of one new vehicle for an inspector.

Chief Koger reported that the district would also like to post the three positions that were agreed on to hire in 2024, in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter so the new hires can have a start date for February 2024.

Treasurer Anderson made a motion to lift the hiring freeze and promotional process that was set in May 2023, and move the process back in the hands of fire operations. Secretary Fernandez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Anderson made a motion to sign the contract for the new Engine to lock in the price. Director Huwa seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Anderson made a motion to move forward in hiring two firefighters, and 1 EMS personnel. Director Huwa seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **Deputy Chief of Operations Report:**

Deputy Chief Noel reported accreditation is still moving forward. Everything has been turned in and is now in review. Chief Koger and I have started to review the documents.

Chief Noel reported that he is still currently working on updating and converting SOG into a new format.

He reported that he met with Commerce City Police Department to work on a better system on working together on high stressful calls. Along with better communication during calls.





Chief Noel reported B-shift Tech Rescue worked with City of Thornton Fire Department for 16 hours helping to securely rescue a person off a Tower.

Chief Noel reported that SACFD received 9 life packs today, 4 for ALS units.

Chief Noel reported Captain Metish secured a trailer for the grant with the high schools' home building project.

Chief Noel referred to significant calls per unit as reported in his written report provided in the Board packet for July.

### **Board of Directors Report/Comments:**

All Board members thanked everyone for being patient through the workplace investigation and thanked everyone for holding everything together during this time.

Treasurer Anderson thanked SACFD for the tower rescue and was proud of how well all the departments worked together on the call.

Secretary Fernandez requested to have a tour of the district.

Vice President Bullock - extended her condolences on the passing of Bob Hutchings.

Director Huwa recognized and thanked the district for the work on attaining grants and the budget process. He said it's time to get back to business.

President Machuga thanked the district on the grants and for being able to move forward through the workplace investigation. He congratulated everyone on a good job.
